Affidavit of Probable Cause

Commonwealth v. Jamal Reid

Overview of Investigation

Between May of 2021 and March of 2022, police departments in Montgomery, Philadelphia, and Bucks Counties have investigated over twenty-five armed robberies and burglaries that have a similar *modus operandi*. Due to this trend, a multi-jurisdictional task force was established to investigate. The burglaries and robberies—all having a common plan, scheme, and design—are believed to have been committed by the same person(s).

The burglaries generally target commercial establishments with skill machines in the overnight hours. In each of the thefts, the actor targeted primarily the business' cash registers and skill machines. Most of the incidents were caught on surveillance, and in each, the suspect(s) obscured their face by clothing and other coverings. One suspect appearing in all the burglaries appeared to be a thin black male with large thick-rimmed glasses that were unique in nature.

At first, investigators did not realize the connection because the burglaries were spread out throughout Montgomery, Bucks, and Philadelphia Counties. This affidavit is the direct result of the collaboration between different agencies within these counties to identify a serial criminal.

Upper Moreland Seldon Motors Burglary

On December 28, 2021, Seldon Motors reported an overnight burglary to the Upper Morland Police Department. During this burglary, Seldon Motors reported that at some point overnight, the garage door was cut open and two luxury cars were stolen. Taken was a black Mercedes C Class sedan and a white BMW 750i. Upper Moreland Detective Mark Bouldin was assigned to investigate the burglary.

On February 27, 2022, Detective Bouldin was assigned to investigate another burglary at a local Shell station. After a review of surveillance video from that burglary, a suspect by the name of Jamal REID was identified. REID was observed arriving at the Shell station operating one of the stolen vehicles from Seldon Motors.

At some point after the Upper Moreland burglaries, the Philadelphia Police Department arrested REID for a shooting that occurred in the city. Detective Bouldin then started reviewing a string of burglaries with similar targets and modus operandi reported in nearby jurisdictions in an attempt to link REID to the burglaries.

Multi-Jurisdictional Task Force

After the identification of REID, Detective Bouldin learned of similar burglaries in Cheltenham Township as well as the City of Philadelphia. During the course of the investigation, Detective Bouldin issued an intelligence bulletin

which was viewed by numerous departments across the Delaware Valley. Several departments then reported similar burglaries and a task force was created to collaborate between jurisdictions.

Arrest of REID

On March 5, 2022, Philadelphia Police Officers started looking for REID in the Philadelphia area ultimately observing him in the area of 67th St and Ogontz Avenue operating the same Mercedes Benz reported stolen from the December 28, 2021, Seldon Motors burglary. The same Philadelphia Police Officers involved in the arrest of REID in 2021 for an unrelated shooting incident assisted in the search. In addition to driving the stolen car from that burglary, REID was also wearing a red sweatshirt consistent with a red sweatshirt observed on surveillance video from the Seldon Motors burglary. REID fled from Philadelphia Police at a high rate of speed and was not located.

On March 8, 2022, the same Philadelphia Police Officers from the March 5, 2022, incident again located REID operating the stolen Mercedes in the 1600 block of N. 68th Street, Philadelphia, PA. REID fled into a residence in the area and a barricade situation was declared. REID was ultimately arrested and detained for the Philadelphia shooting.

After his arrest in connection to the Philadelphia shooting, an iPad and a cell phone were seized from REID. A search warrant was executed on the devices and law enforcement found photographs on the iPad which depicted REID

wearing clothing consistent with the clothing worn by the actor in some of the burglaries.

Bucks County Incidents

During the course of his investigation, Detective Bouldin learned of multiple burglaries which occurred in Bensalem, Bucks County wherein DNA was recovered from the crime scenes. The Bensalem Police Department has a contract with a forensic company called BODE which includes access to a Rapid DNA analysis machine. Bensalem Police eventually submitted the DNA samples recovered from their burglaries and sought a comparison to REID. The comparison yielded a positive match which indicates that REID is a contributor to the DNA samples recovered from their burglary scenes.

The Bucks County District Attorney's Office moved forward with their incidents involving REID. Between May 24, 2022, and May 25, 2022, the Bensalem Police Department charged REID with two armed robberies occurring on April 14, 2021, and March 2, 2022, respectively. REID plead guilty to both robberies and was sentenced to 5 – 10 years in a state correctional institution.

Follow-up Investigation

As the Bucks County cases were being processed, Detective Bouldin started working with other police departments in Montgomery County and the Philadelphia Police Department in an effort to identify other burglaries possibly

involving REID. During the investigation, Detective Bouldin utilized DNA, cell phone, fingerprint, and other direct identification evidence.

Several different police departments who had open investigations into incidents consistent with REID's *modus operandi* had collected DNA from their crime scenes. Some of these departments had already sent the samples to the State Police Forensic Laboratory for testing. In an effort to consolidate the multiple open investigations, Detective Bouldin contacted PSP and requested a master report be completed. On January 13, 2023, the final report was sent to Detective Bouldin. REID's DNA was included as a potential contributor on a number of different founded burglaries. Specific instances of positive DNA inclusions are described in further detail below.

In addition to the DNA evidence, several of the scenes were processed for fingerprints. REID's fingerprints were able to be matched via AFIS ("Automated Fingerprint Identification System") hits by the Pennsylvania State Police. Specific instances of positive fingerprint hits are described in further detail below.

Forensic Analysis of Cellular Phone & iPad

During the investigation, the iPad and cell phone seized during REID's arrest in Philadelphia were sent to the Montgomery County Detective Bureau for analysis. Strategic Intelligence Analyst Supervisor Nicholas Devine performed the analysis. Analyst Devine has previously been qualified as an expert in the fields of Forensic Cellular Phone Analysis & Cell Mapping. While the iPad had no

relevant evidence with respect to GPS data, the cellular phone was able to provide REID's cellular phone number.

Analyst Devine worked with Detective Bouldin to secure and execute a search warrant for the phone number linked to REID's cellular phone. The phone was identified as having AT&T as the provider and "JAMALL READ" as the subscriber with a home address consistent with that of REID. The search warrant returned two sets of critical information that included specific, Call Detail Records and NELOS records.

The difference between the Call Detail Records and the NELOS records is how the data is obtained. With the Call Detail Records, if a communication is made between the cell tower and the device—typically a phone call, text, or straight data connection, the records indicate both the general vicinity of the device by indicating which tower is used as well as the direction the tower is facing. With respect to the NELOS records, this data is created when the device connects to either a Bluetooth or Wi-Fi connection and consistently updates a general location to the phone company. Both of these records are used by the phone companies for the purpose of "strength of signal" service—or, in other words, to make sure they most appropriately find the strongest signal available for their customers.

Analyst Devine reviewed the records and identified numerous instances of location data consistent with the times and locations of burglaries in which REID

is a suspect. Instances in which digital evidence connects REID to each burglary is explained in further detail below.

Confession of REID

On January 10, 2023, Upper Moreland Police Detectives Bouldin and Smith traveled to Pennsylvania State Correctional Facility (SCI) Smithfield to attempt to interview REID about the collection of burglaries linked to him through the aforementioned evidence. Detective Bouldin read REID his *Miranda* rights and REID agreed to speak about the burglaries.

Detective Bouldin confronted REID on each burglary in which he was suspected of committing. REID ultimately confessed to nine (9) of them. For the burglaries in which REID did not confess, he did not deny participation but instead simply stated "I do not remember." This statement was formally memorialized by a written breakdown of all the burglaries.







Conclusion

Between May of 2021 and March of 2022, there were well over twenty-five (25) unsolved burglaries that had a similar *modus operandi*. The remaining cases are still under investigation. There were several similarities between all of the burglaries—including the time the crimes were committed, the type of establishments targeted, the mode of entry, the items stolen (cash registers, skill machines, etc.), and the identification of consistent clothing and features by the main actor involved.

As a direct result of the evidence obtained as a result of the investigation, including DNA, fingerprint, cell phone, iPad, Call Detail Record, NELOS, and video surveillance, REID has been charged with the following counts:

Robbery: Fear of SBI (F-1) - 2 counts

Conspiracy - Robbery: Fear of SBI (F-1) - 1 count

Burglary: No Person Present (F-2) - 19 counts

Conspiracy – Burglary: No Person Present (F-2) – 7 counts

Attempt – Burglary: No Person Present (F-2) – 1 count

Theft by Unlawful Taking (F-3) - 8 counts

Theft by Unlawful Taking (M-1) - 7 counts

Theft by Unlawful Taking (M-2) – 2 counts

Attempt – Theft by Unlawful Taking (M-2) – 3 counts

Criminal Mischief (F-3) - 1 count

Criminal Mischief (M-2) - 10 counts

Criminal Mischief (S) - 1 count

Possession of an Instrument of Crime (M-1) - 13 counts

Theft from a Motor Vehicle (M-3) - 1 count Loitering/Prowling at Night (M-3) - 1 count

In addition to the crimes charges, as a direct result of damages to property and thefts from the business', the estimated total loss for all of the jobs is \$290,761.37.
