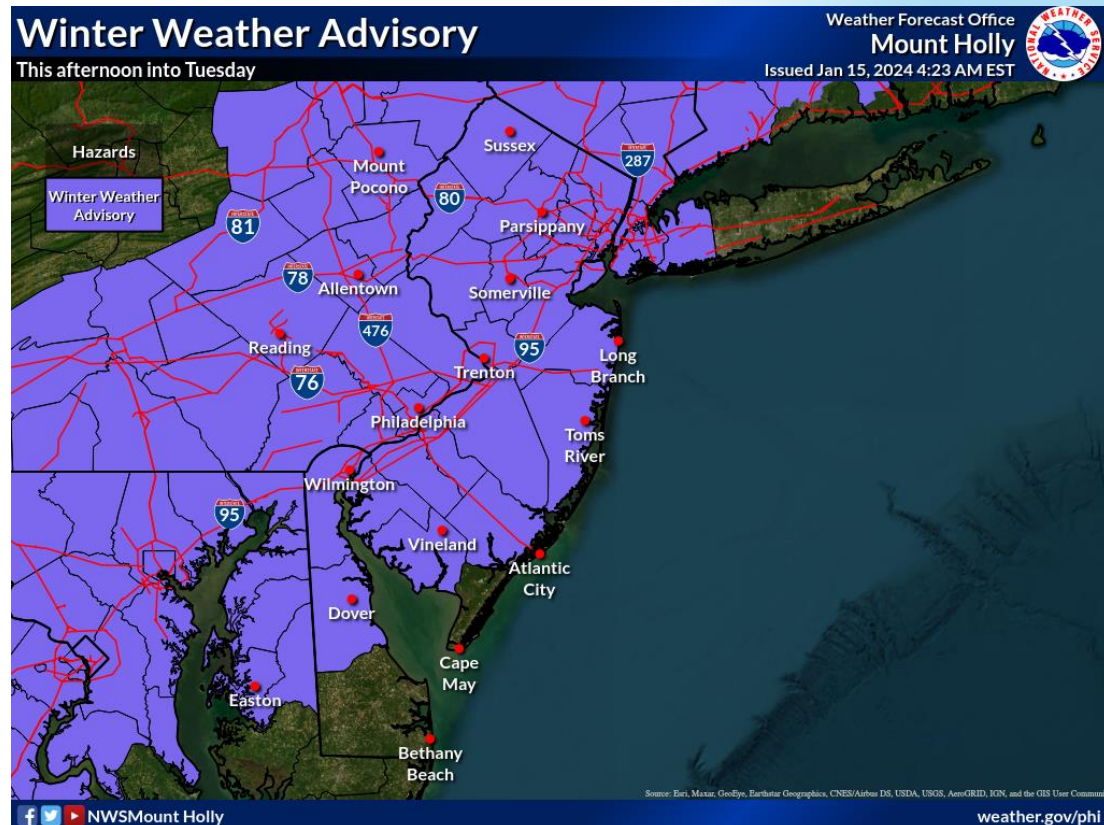

What Has Changed?

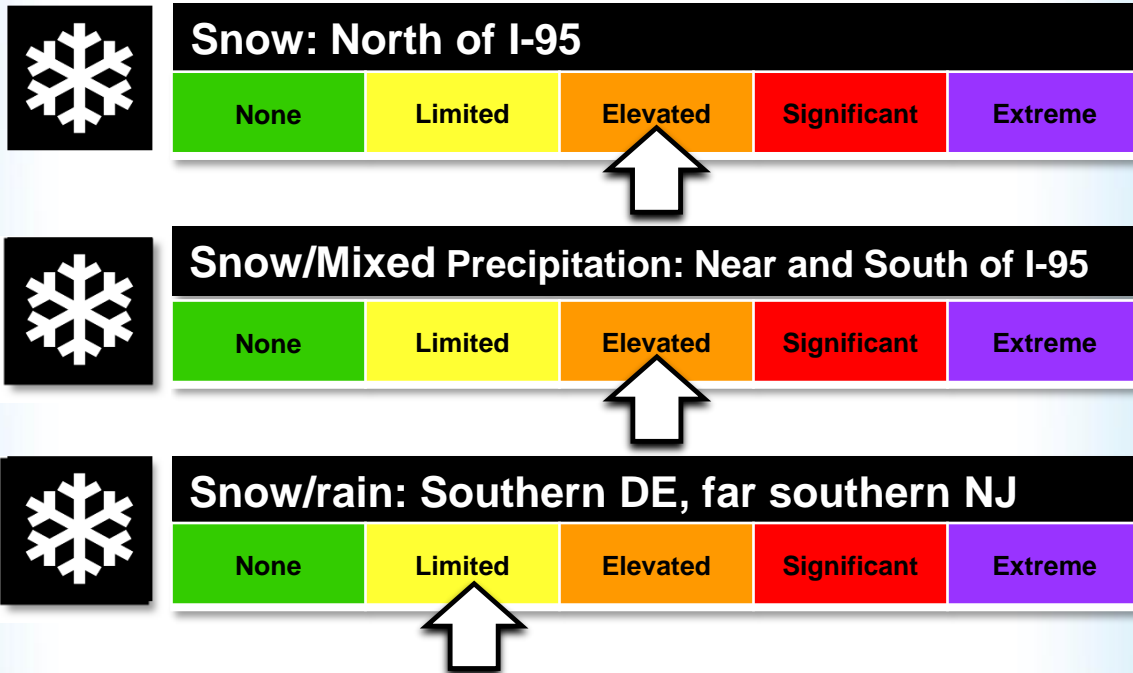
- ✓ Initial briefing

Main Points

Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Snow 	Widespread accumulating snowfall will impact the Tuesday morning commute	North of the I-95 corridor	Monday evening through Tuesday
Period of Snow & Mixed Precipitation 	Snow occasionally mixed with sleet, freezing rain, and rain will impact the Tuesday morning commute.	Along and south of the I-95 corridor	Monday afternoon through Tuesday morning

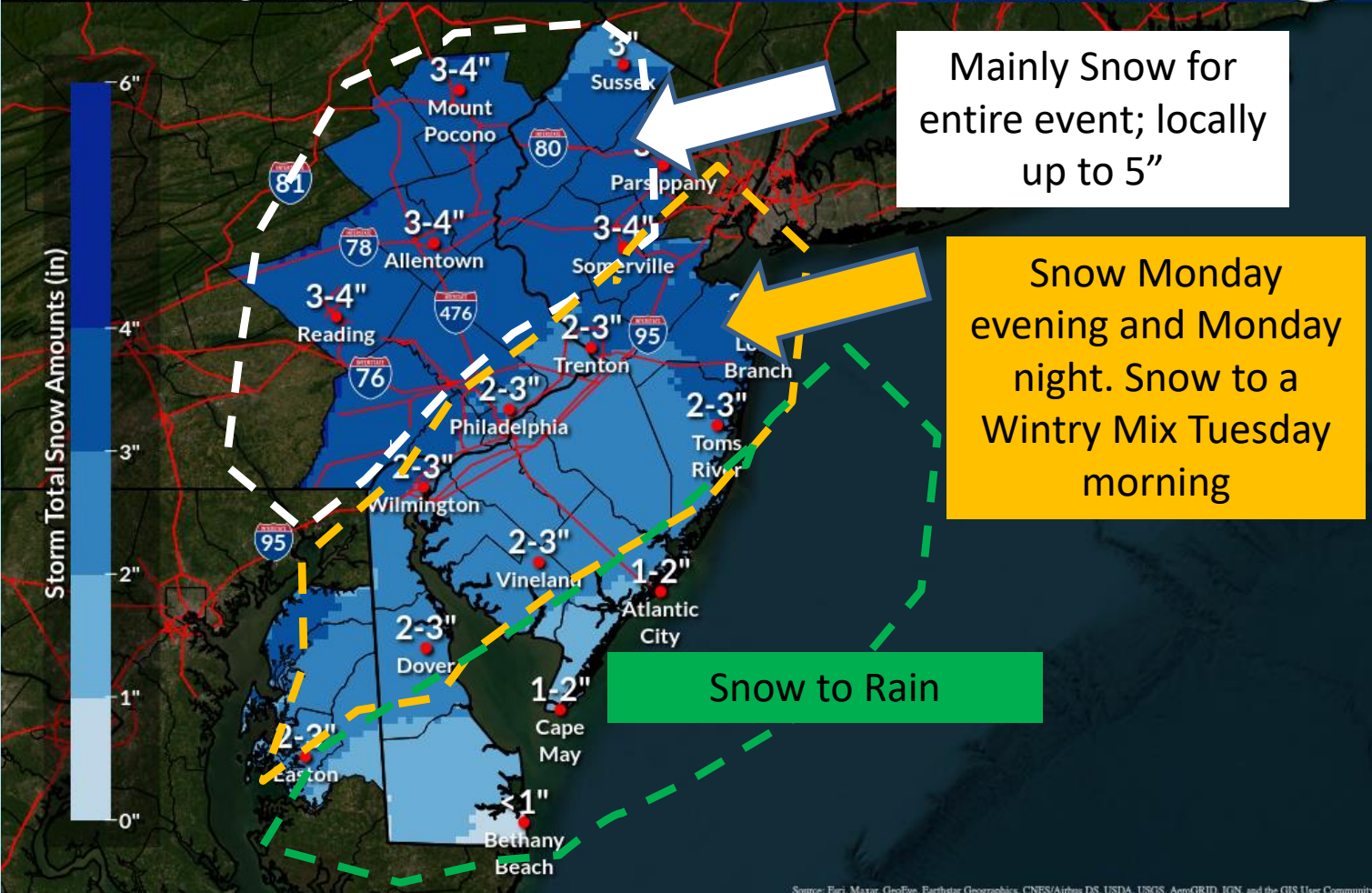

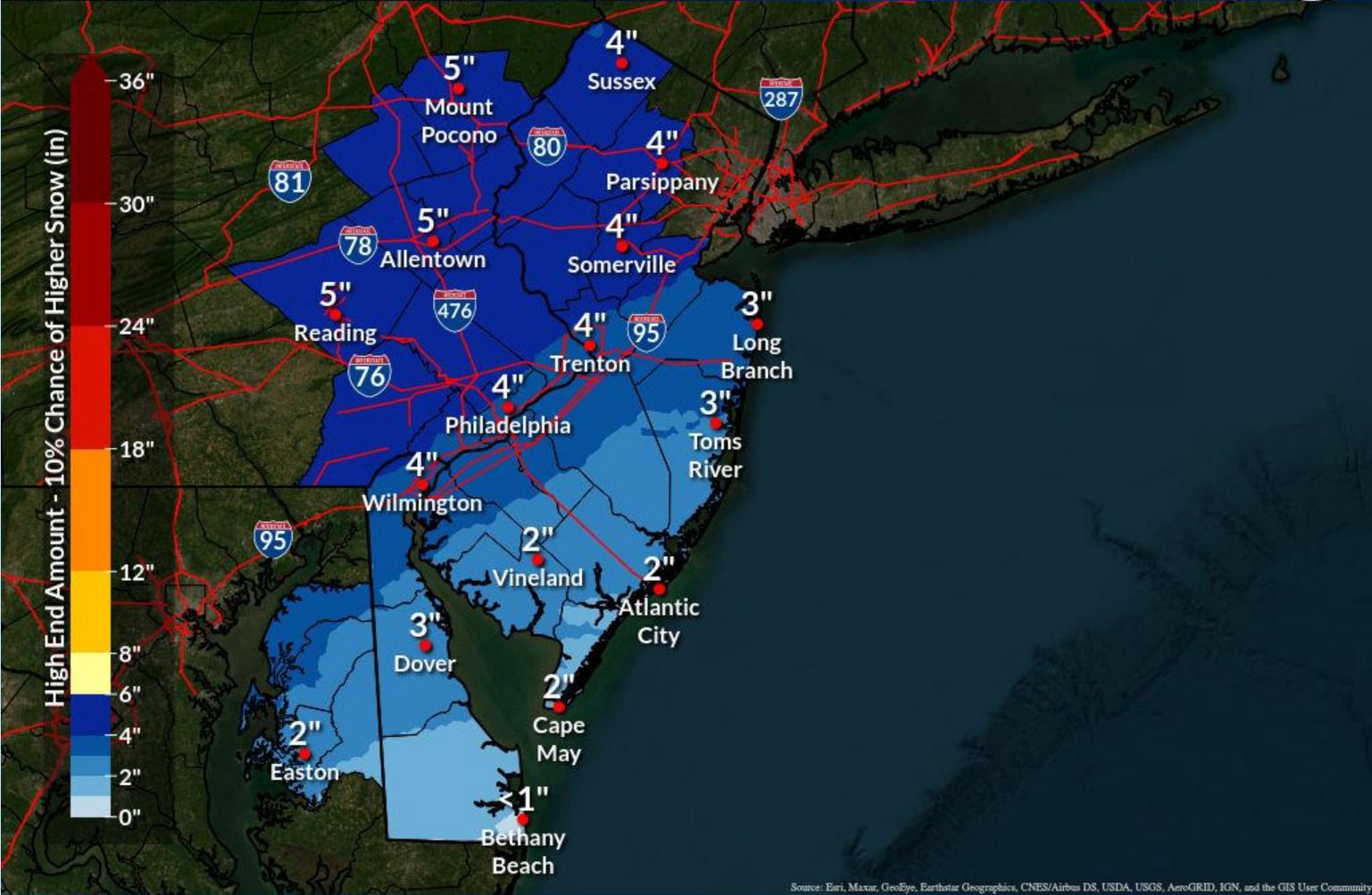


High End Amount - 1 in 10 Chance (10%) Of Higher Snowfall

Event Summary

- ✓ An area of mainly light snow will move into the region from south to north beginning Monday afternoon over Delmarva and reaching the I-95 corridor and points north and west through early to mid evening.
- ✓ Snow will continue overnight while eventually becoming mixed with sleet, freezing rain, and rain near and south of the I-95 corridor Tuesday morning.
- ✓ Snow and mixed precipitation will taper off from southwest to northeast Tuesday morning through the early afternoon.
- ✓ Total snowfall of 2 to 4 inches is generally expected across much of the forecast area with a light glaze of ice also possible especially near the I-95 corridor.
- ✓ An arctic front will move through in the system's wake bringing the coldest air of the season thus far. Highs Wednesday are forecast to be in the 20s or colder with daytime wind chill values in the single digits and teens.
