




Wintry Precipitation – Feb 8-9, 2025

Decision Support Briefing #3
Update for neighboring hazards
As of: 4 PM Friday, Feb 7, 2025

What Has Changed?

- ✓ Winter Weather Advisory issued for a large portion of the area
- ✓ No significant changes to the forecast, but a slight reduction in snowfall amounts north of I-78

Wintry Mix and Ice



A mix of snow, sleet, and freezing rain may lead to icy roads and hazardous travel.

Total snow and sleet amounts of a coating to 2" and ice amounts up to 0.2".

Delmarva, southern NJ, and Philadelphia metro into the I-78 corridor.
Greatest accumulations and threat for impacts farther north. Lowest risk for impacts across southern DE and southern coastal NJ.

Precipitation beginning as early as 12 PM to 4 PM Saturday afternoon, but primarily focused during Saturday evening between 4 PM and 1 AM. Precipitation ending between 1 AM to 7AM Sunday from south to north.

Snow to Wintry Mix



Snow changing to a wintry mix may lead to icy roads and hazardous travel. Total snow and sleet accumulations of 2-5" and ice amounts up to 0.1".

North of I-78. Greatest snow/sleet accumulations across the Poconos and northern NJ, mainly along and north of the I-80 corridor.

Precipitation beginning between 4 PM to 7 PM Saturday, but primarily focused during Saturday night between 7 PM and 1 AM. Precipitation ending by around 4 AM to 7 AM Sunday morning.










Summary of Greatest Impacts







Expected Ice Accumulations




- ✓ Snow, sleet, and freezing rain are all expected in a messy mixed bag of wintry precip from Saturday afternoon through early Sunday morning.
- Many locations will start as light snow before changing over to a wintry mix Saturday evening and overnight.
- Exact timing of precipitation types remain less certain.
- ✓ Key Takeaway: Icy or snowy roads leading to hazardous travel expected beginning late Saturday afternoon through early Sunday morning.







Expected Snowfall Accumulation



- Precipitation beginning briefly as snow/sleet for most locations Saturday afternoon/evening before changing to a wintry mix
- ✓ Greatest snow and sleet accumulations of 2-4" (locally near 5" in northern NJ) focused north of I-78. A coating to 2" possible farther south.
- Exact timing of precipitation types remain less certain.
- ✓ Key Takeaway: Icy or snowy roads leading to hazardous travel expected beginning late Saturday afternoon through early Sunday morning.














Precipitation Type Forecast 1 PM Saturday

Chance of light snow beginning Saturday afternoon























































Event Summary

- ✓ While there remains some uncertainty in the exact timing of precipitation types,
 the main takeaway remains the same: wintry precipitation will lead to icy and
 slippery conditions Saturday evening through early Sunday morning.
- ✓ Precipitation beginning as early as Saturday afternoon. A wintry mix of snow, sleet, and freezing rain are forecast across many areas near and south of I-78. North of I-78, mostly snow to start Saturday evening, mixing with some sleet and freezing rain overnight. As milder air works in from the south into the night, any wintry precipitation will change to plain rain from south to north into the Philadelphia metro overnight Saturday night into early Sunday morning. Precipitation ending completely by around daybreak Sunday.
- ✓ Temperatures are expected to climb well above freezing on Sunday in most areas with highs in the mid 30s to mid 40s, along with breezy conditions and decreasing clouds. Thus, any hazardous road conditions, mainly north of I-95 by daybreak Sunday morning, will likely improve as the day progresses.
- ✓ Another system will bring potential for more significant snowfall on Tuesday & Tuesday night. This may impact the Tuesday morning and/or Tuesday evening commutes. The first complete snowfall forecast for this event will be available beginning with the Saturday night/Sunday morning midnight shift update.
