

→ Confidence continues to increase in accumulating snowfall as a storm system impacts the region Sunday into Monday. Exact amounts remain uncertain.






Watches, Warnings, & Advisories

Through This Morning



Key Messages

- A **Winter Weather Advisory** remains in effect until 12 PM today for Carbon and Monroe Counties in PA, and Sussex County, NJ.
- Freezing rain and some snow/sleet is anticipated for these areas.
- Ice accumulations of 0.10" to 0.20" are expected, with snow/sleet accumulations of less than one inch.
- Elsewhere, rainfall amounts are expected to be around 0.25-0.50 inches with localized areas up to 1.00 inch possible.






Expected Ice Accumulations

Through This Morning



Key Messages

- Precipitation will continue through this morning before diminishing by early afternoon.
- Ice accumulations of 0.10" to 0.20" are expected, which will lead to slippery road conditions. **Icy conditions could impact this morning's commute.**






Expected Snow Accumulations

February 20, 2026
4:45 AM EST

Through This Morning



Key Messages

- Precipitation is expected to begin late this evening, with a **mix of light freezing rain and snow/sleet**. Precipitation will continue into Friday morning before diminishing by early Friday afternoon.
- Snow/sleet accumulations are expected to be less than one inch, but could still contribute to slippery travel conditions. **The hazardous conditions could impact the Friday morning commute.**






Weekend Storm

February 20, 2026
4:45 AM EST

Sunday into Monday

Key Messages

- A low pressure system Sunday into Monday is likely to bring wintry precipitation across the region.
 - The probability of at least light snow accumulations of 2" or more have increased to around 60-80%.
 - Minor to moderate coastal flooding impacts possible along the Atlantic coast.
- Two main scenarios depicted in models currently:
 - A pass closer to the coast would mean more impacts with coastal flooding, wind, snow/wintry mix, and marine navigation concerns.
 - A pass farther southeast would mean still some light wintry precipitation (mostly snow), but lower winds, less risk of widespread tidal flooding, and less impacts overall.





Summary of Greatest Impacts

Key Messages

- A **Winter Weather Advisory** is in effect until 12 PM today for Carbon and Monroe Counties in PA, and Sussex County, NJ. **A mix of light freezing rain and snow/sleet** is anticipated for these areas, with **ice accumulations of 0.10" to 0.20"**, and **snow/sleet accumulations less than one inch**.
- An area of low pressure is expected to bring impacts to portions of the the region Sunday into Monday, with potential for **accumulating snow, strong winds, and coastal flooding**. However, **uncertainty remains high** with respect to specific details.
- Details regarding the weekend storm system will become more clear through tonight.
